

# Canadian Disc Dog Association

Disc Dog is a fun sport for any dog that loves to retrieve flying discs. CCDA sanctioned Disc Dog Trials offer competition that challenges handlers and dogs to make as many disc catches as they can in two one-minute rounds. The handler/dog team earns points according to the distance at which the disc was caught. Official fastback flying discs are used in competition and are provided by the trial organizers.

Participants can compete at many levels, earning points towards a championship, legs towards a title or the high point dog distinction at a trial.

As well as official events, the CDDA encourages trial organizers to host unofficial events. These are fun events created by host clubs. No titles or points are awarded at these events, but teams can still win prizes or rosettes.

To compete in a CDDA sanctioned trial to earn points and titles, all dog and handler teams must have a CDDA competition number. This number is used to keep track of the team's points and legs earned towards its disc dog titles. The CDDA competition number is a lifelong number for the team and does not need to be renewed.

## EARNING CDDA POINTS AND TITLES

### DISTANCE COMPETITION POINTS

In the distance competition teams are given one official Fastback disc and two one-minute rounds in which to make as many successful throws and catches as they can. Points are earned as follows:

- ?? *Catches over 10 metres earn 1 point each*
- ?? *Catches over 15 metres earn 3 points each*
- ?? *Catches over 20 metres earn 5 points each*

Any catches in which all four of the dog's feet leave the ground are awarded an extra point.

### TITLES

#### **Basic Disc Dog (BDD)**

This title is earned when four qualifying legs are earned. A leg is earned each time the team has four successful catches over the 20 metre line in 7 or fewer throws and within the two one-minute rounds.

#### **Advanced Disc Dog (ADD)**

This title is earned when four qualifying legs are earned. A leg is earned each time the team has four successful catches over the 30 metre line in 7 or fewer throws and within the two one-minute rounds.

### POINTS

All points earned at sanctioned events will be tabulated. Teams accumulating points can earn the following awards:

#### **Disc Dog (DD)**

This award is earned by teams accumulating 100 points at sanctioned disc dog trials.

#### **Disc Dog Excellent (DDX)**

This award is earned by teams accumulating 300 points at sanctioned disc dog trials.

#### **Disc Dog Champion (DDCh)**

This award is earned by teams accumulating 500 points at sanctioned disc dog trials.

Titles and Points are also available for the Freestyle competition.

### Your CDDA Competition Number must be used at all CDDA Sanctioned events.

This number will allow the CDDA to keep track of the points you and your dog accumulate at sanctioned competitions. The CDDA will award titles to dogs that have met the requirements. The CDDA also awards certificates for RTP scores of 4 or 5 and qualifying ribbons for qualifying rounds in the distance competition. Your CDDA Competition Number represents a team of one person and one dog. The same handler must compete with the same dog to earn points.
