GUIDES CANINS CANINE GOOD NEIGHBOUR TEST

IMPORTANT! FOR YOUR INFORMATION:

- These Canine Good Neighbour tests, sanctioned by the CKC (Canadian Kennel Club) will be held outside at GUIDES CANINS, in conjunction with other events.
- To participate in these tests, purebred or mix bred dogs must be at least 12 months old, must have proof of vaccination or certificate and be in good standing with their municipality (must have a tag or a proof of registration according to the applicable local dog control law).
- The purpose of the test is to identify and reward responsible, caring owners and their canine partners
 throughout Canada. To ensure that our beloved companion, the dog, is accepted as a valued member
 of our communities right across the country. Canine Good Neighbors can be counted on to have good
 manners at home, in public places and in the presence of other dogs.
- The test is non-competitive and allows dog and handler to demonstrate confidence and control in 12 situations. It assesses the handler/dog relationship, along with the handler's ability to control the dog. Dogs are evaluated on their ability to perform basic exercises as well as their ability to demonstrate good manners in everyday situations.
- The CGN test embraces both purebred and mixed-breed dogs and is fun, rewarding, and useful. It encourages owners to have a better and richer relationship with their dogs. The program also enhances community awareness of responsible dog ownership and the numerous benefits associated with such ownership. The Canadian Kennel Club encourages all dog owners to participate in the program, ensuring that our beloved canines are welcome and respected members of our communities.
- Entries are limited. we reserve the right to refuse any entry.
- The registration form is available on our website.
- An invoice will be sent to you by email. Payment must be made promptly after receipt of this invoice. Registration will be valid only after receipt of payment.
- Payment can be made by electronic transfer to info@guidescanins.com with the answer to the question your dog's name in all small letters without spaces, without accent or by credit card directly from your account.
- Registration costs \$37+tx (\$42.54)
- The closing date of the pre-registration will be the Wednesday before the test.
- It will be possible to register after the closing date or on site if the registration limit has not been reached. The cost of late registrations will be \$44+tx (50.58).
- A confirmation will be sent on Thursday before the test. A running order will be produced but it will change due to the on-site registration.
- Successful teams will eventually obtain a CKC certificate..
- A refund will be issued for dogs and handlers that are injured, providing that they send a doctor or veterinarian note and that the trial secretary is advised within 24 hours of the start of the test.
- Any refund issued will be minus a 10% administrative fee. A \$20 fees will be charged for NSF checks and refused credit cards.
